He was buried at the Wharton City Cemetery.

He moved from his family's home in Texas to become the labor manager on a plantation near Pledger, Texas belonging to Dr. Brown (who was the father of Peter Robinson Brown) on July 4, 1860. At the outbreak of the Civil War, Toliver Taylor and his brother Tyre joined the company of soldiers formed at Wharton under the command of Captain Ed Rugeley (Co F, Brown's Regiment). They spent the war years at the old dirt fort at Matagorda. A member of this company was Green C. Duncan who owned 576 acres of land (known as the Galbreath place) near Pledger. After they were mustered out of the war at Tyler, Texas in 1865, the Taylor brothers and Duncan formed a partnership. The Taylors were to farm the Duncan land for five years, at which time, land, stock, improvements, and cash were to be divided equally. George Taylor furnished his sons' farm with stock, horses, hogs, and cattle. The Taylor brothers had one silver dollar and a twenty dollar gold piece. The silver dollar bought quinine to combat malaria. The gold piece bought a circle saw. The saw was cut into quarters and

used as plow shares and on tree trunks cut from the woods. With these home-made plows, they made their first crop in 1865. Their business grew and prospered from this humble beginning. The business known as W. T. Taylor and Bro. was headquartered at the Don Tol Plantation. The Don Tol Plantation derived its name from the laborers' name for Toliver Taylor. They called him Don Tol - "Don" being the Spanish title meaning "Mr.". In 1900, the two brothers divided their holdings which included 19,000 acres. Tyre moved to Parkdale. Toliver Taylor never married.

In 1892, he came to Texas and ran the commissary and kept the books on the Taylor Plantation near Pledger in Wharton County. Zack Taylor was the labor manager and part farmer. Toliver ("Bud") Taylor and Tyre Taylor were the owners. The plantation was divided about 1902 - Tol taking the South half and Tyre the North half - when the two brothers fell out over the election of the county sheriff.

DEATH OF MRS. ANDREW HUEBNER.

After an illness of only a few days, Mrs. Loudie Taylor Huebner, departed this life on Friday morning at 11:30 o'clock. Mrs. Huebner had been sick only a few days when she was brought to the sanitarium here for treatment. Deceased was the wife of Mr. Andrew Huebner, one of the county's prominent farmer-citizens south of town. She was born in Colorado county, June 10, 1855, being 59 years, 2 months and 24 days of age. The family came here from Colorado county several years ago and soon were identified with the social and religious life of the community, the deceased becoming a member of the Christian church in which she was a devoted worker, with many warm friends among adherents of all the denominations. Deceased is survived by husband and three daughters and two sons and several grandchildren. The daughters are Mrs. Walter Brown of LaGrange, Mrs. H. J. Hauk of Valley Falls, Kansas, and Miss Ada Huebner of this city. The sons are M. T. and M. D. Huebner, whose home is with the family on the ranch. Funeral services were conducted from the Presbyterian Church, Saturday morning at 10 o'clock, by Reverends J. F. Carter and L. E. Selfridge and the remains followed to Cedar Vale Cemetery by a large concourse of sorrowing friends of the family.

Great Cotton Country.

A. E. Huebner, one of the largest land holders in this county, is very enthusiastic over Matagorda county and the prospects for her becoming one of the greatest cotton counties in Texas. He said that he and his two brothers came to Matagorda county in 1886 and that in 1887 planted their first cotton crop. This they kept up for several years and in all their many crops they did not experience a single entire failure, although one short crop was recorded. The best crop was one of two bales to the acre and the rest ran from one-half to a bale. In late years, however, the Huebner Brothers, whose holdings go beyond 10,000 acres of some of the finest land in Matagorda county, have been stock raising and what cotton they have raised has only been incidental. But Mr. Huebner says that cotton is not an experimental crop here by any means and that this county is as good for the staple, if not better, than any in Texas. He is a strong believer in diversification and gives an interesting account of what might be accomplished in this, the brightest Mid-Coast county. Unkown Book Title

Andrew Huebner, pioneer cattleman of Matagorda County, who has participated in the development of the ranching industry over a period of more than half a century, has one of the larger ranches in the Bay City locality, where he has made his headquarters since 1885. In that year, Mr. Huebner, in association with his father, the late John A. Huebner, bought the Bertrand League and began stocking it with good grade beef cattle, and, since his father's death, Mr. Huebner has operated the ranch alone. He controls ten thousand acres of land, all of which is excellent pasture land, with good grass and water for the twelve hundred head of cattle that he runs. He has consistently graded up his herd, introducing the Hereford and Brahma strains, until he has one of the finest in this locality, with some excellent breeding stock as its nucleus. The spread lies two and three-fourths miles South, and one-half mile West, of Bay City, and is not only one of the oldest ranches in this locality, but one of the best equipped. Mr. Huebner, although past his eightieth year, still rides out every day inspecting his stock, and takes an active part in the supervision of all ranch work. Mr. Huebner was born at La Grange, Texas, on the twenty-ninth day of September, 1853, and is a son of John A. Huebner and Pauline Wilrich Huebner. John A. Huebner, one of the early settlers of Texas, came to the United States from his native Bavaria, Germany, in the late thirties and in 1840 settled in Fayette County, which had been organized two years earlier, he having spent the intervening years in Iowa, and at New Braunfels, in Comal County, Texas. As a boy Mr. Huebner traveled by ox cart, and spent his youth on his father's farm. An observant lad, he soon noticed that while the farm boys had little of no money to spend the rancher's son always had plenty of pocket money, and he then decided to be a cowman, he spending theyears that followed working toward this end, the purchase of the Bertrand League being the most significant achievement of the early years. Mr. Huebner was married on the old Taylor Plantation, where the railway station of Don Tol is now located, in February, 1887, to Miss Loudie Taylor. They have four children: Lola, Lillie, Dudley and Ada. Mr. Huebner is a member of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, and has seldom missed one of its conventions. Ranching has always been to him more than a mere business and means of livelihood, providing him with hobby as well, and he has few equals at handling stock, his special interest being fine cattle and well trained cow ponies.

Andrew Huebner, Pioneer Cattleman Matagorda County, Dies At Age 94
First Came To County In 1886 To Raise Cattle

Mr. Andrew Huebner, pioneer cattleman of Matagorda County, died Thursday evening at 8 o'clock, following an illness of long duration. He was 94 years of age and until recently was still "riding the range" with the younger cowboys on his spread. It was in 1886, sixty two years ago, when Mr. Huebner was then a man of 32 with many tales of the Civil War still vividly in his mind, that he came to Matagorda County from Fayette County where he was born near La Grange. He began then to buy land in the county. In 1909 he moved his family here where they have lived since. Like many members of his family, he was extremely healthy with a constitution which allowed him to perform duties which would have felled many men younger. He thrived on outdoor life and hard work, enjoying his roundups with the enthusiasm of a tender foot. At 94 one would have considered him at a ripe old age, but he was four years a junior to his sister, Mrs. Lillie Richers who is now 98. And besides Mrs. Richers there is a younger brother surviving, Mr. Franz Huebner who is now 90. Both reside in Bay City. Another brother, Louis, preceded him in death. He too, had reached near the ninety mark at the time of his death. Mr. Huebner is also survived by two daughters, Mrs. Ada Hurst of Bay City and Mrs. Lola H. Brown of Ft. Worth; one son, M. D. Huebner of Bay City and several grandchildren and great grandchildren. Taylor Bros., are in charge of the arrangements but announcement of the funeral is withheld awaiting arrival of relatives. Excerpt from Historic Matagorda:

A Letter from Woodlief F. Brown to Lucille Huebner Wilkinson, dated November 21, 1961.

Grandpa's (Andrew Huebner) story about coming to Bay Prairie was as follows:

Shanghai Pierce was a "brainy" man who foresaw that the day of the free range was coming to an end. He began buying up all the land that he could buy. Much of the Gulf Coast was owned by people in New York and other places. He talked about it to his good friend, Tol Taylor. Tol Taylor said, "Now when the Bertrand League comes on the market, keep your hand off, I want it." Eventually Shanghai advised Tol Taylor that the Bertrand League was for sale. Tol Taylor went to Fayette County in a buggy and brought his young brother-in-law, Andrew Huebner, to see it, since he believed there was a good fortune for him in ranching on the coast. "The Bertrand League is the prettiest land in Bay Prairie, and it has water at both ends," he said. Grandpa (Andrew Huebner) did not have enough money to swing the deal so went to his father, John Andrew Huebner, with it. Grandpa related, "Father, raised in the hills of Bavaria, did not like the flat coast country, but said if I would buy a third of it, he would buy the rest." Grandpa made the purchase and borrowed a horse from Tol Taylor to go to Matagorda to record it, as Taylor told him would be necessary. He had to get to Matagorda by running the horse across the prairie from one herd of cattle to another. Mosquitoes were so bad that the cattle bunched up for protection and at each herd he could rest a little. I asked Grandpa this: "If great-grandpa Huebner (John Andrew Huebner) came out of the Civil War with nothing but a lot of Confederate money, how had he accumulated the cash he had for the purchase?" He said, "Well, for one thing, he sold a tract of land up in Fayette County – 300 acres for \$10 and acre." I remarked that it seemed like a pretty big price. He said, "Yes it was. The land wasn't worth that much, but it had a good cedar rail fence around it, and the fence was worth more than the land was. You see, father (John Andrew) read the newspapers, an uncommon thing in Texas then, and he said there was a product coming on the market called barbed wire, and when it gets in common usage, cedar rail fences won't be worth a thing. So he sold that 300 acres."

First Lieutenant Taylor of the U. S. Army Air Corps was killed when his plane was shot down during the Second World War. He served as a bomber pilot in the Pacific Theater. On that day, the plane in which Lt. Taylor was a pilot, participated in the bombing of Japanese shipping in Tonkin Gulf. The plane was hit by antiaircraft fire while bombing a freighter and destroyer anchored close up to the West coast of Hainan Island. As a youth, Glenn Brooks lived close to the soil, following in the footsteps of his farmer father and learned to love the land and everything related to farming. He was beloved by the negroes of the farm who called him the "Chief." When his mother told one of them how concerned Glenn Brooks was that the Chinese had beaten his pet dog, the old negro said, "Miss Ida, we'd send 'em every dog in the quarters if they'd just send the Chief back." He was a graduate of Boling High School in 1940 and went to work for Texas Gulf Sulphur Company soon after that time. While employed by them, he enlisted in the U. S. Army Air Corps. He was a member of the 14th Air Force, the famous Flying Tigers of China. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal, and an Oak Leaf Cluster.

Little Virginia announced, "A red bird told me to bring this tree;" and Audry "A blue bird told me to tell the young ladies to see why I brought this tree." Mr. and Mrs. Huebner left for a bridal visit to Galveston, and after July 1 will be at home to their friends at Bay City. The many handsome presents received attests the popularity of Mr. and Mrs. Huebner, among them being a complete dining room suite from Mr. A. Huebner and son, Dudley; a chest of silver from Mrs. M. D. Taylor, cut glass water set from Mr. and Mrs. G. G. Mick, silver butter knives from Mrs. Van Arnold, orange spoons from Mrs. J. O. Dabney of Florence, Ala.; silver sandwich tray from Mr. and Mrs. Amos Mick; cut glass fern dish, Miss Leslie Mick; punch set, Mrs. W. L. Excerpts from an interview of Leta Belle by George Lee Huebner, Jr. and Nancy Allen Huebner:

"I taught at Iago 3 years before I married. We sent out invitations to all the school parents and everybody - the whole town was invited if they wanted to. The reason I said that - because I got about 300 presents. I had more presents, I tell you - nice ones, and a whole lot of cut glass - more than anything else. And anyway, we were married in the morning, and then we ate dinner in Richmond and went down to the Bristol Hotel and stayed all night at the Bristol Hotel and went down to Galveston the next morning and spent the next day and night down in Galveston."

Did you go on the train?

"No, we went in the car. He had a Saxon Roadster. I don't suppose they make the Saxons anymore. I thought they wouldn't have so much trouble, you know, with such a big to-do, but it was a big thing anyway. A lot of them stayed overnight - the guests. And Kiki, of course, fed them all."

Why did your minister come all the way from Houston?

"We didn't have a minister there - you see Kiki organized the Sunday school and we just had a visiting minister when you could get one. That was Dr. Johnson. He's the one from Ireland. I guess he's dead and gone by now. I've got his picture in there."

("... the couple tried to slip away without being seen" from the newspaper clipping from the wedding.

"We did, and Bernard got in front of the car and wouldn't get out of the way. I haven't heard the announcement party notes (newspaper clipping) in a long time. I know we did, and we had a big cake pan that was made in the shape of a heart, and I guess they used angel food cake recipe or something, anyway some white cake and it's a great big heart about like this

(circle made with whole arms) and it's hanging on the wall out there in the little house. Kiki had it made when Loudie married because they wanted a big wedding cake and nobody had a pan like that and so she had the people in Wharton to make one for them - the blacksmith I guess you'd call him. And that's the last cake I made - one for Billy's 6th birthday and it takes about 3 recipes of Angel food cake to fill it and so I was going to make a big cake for him and for some crazy reason - I guess 'cause there was too much dough in it for it to cook through, the thing fell. It just went down to about an inch and one-half through. It really ruined it - that cake wasn't good at all and so we got along without the cake, but I never made another cake. I haven't made a cake since then. I said there's two things I'm not going to ever do any more - I'm not going to ever cook a roast and I'm not going to make a cake."

M. T. Huebner Died At Clint

A telegram was received here today from Clint, Texas, announced the death of Mr. M. T. Huebner who has been in the El Paso section for the past several months in the interest of his health. Mr. Huebner was afflicted with tuberculosis, but was getting along fine until pneumonia sat in a few days ago. The telegram stated that the funeral will take place in El Paso. Mr. Huebner was the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Huebner and was reared on the Huebner plantation near here. Besides his parents he is survived by his wife and four children. This paper will endeavor to get a fuller account of the life of Mr. Huebner for a later issue. [Matagorda County Newspaper, November 18, 1927]

Two Retiring Teachers Talk Issues, Memories

Education by Eugene Cox Jr.

Mary Sicilio, who retired Friday after 34 years of teaching, believes career ladder placements are going to cause a lot of unhappiness, dissatisfaction and concern among teachers. "It's not what it should be," said Sicilio, a third-grade teacher at College Hill Elementary School for 19 years. "How can they evaluate? Does it tell you what type of teacher you are? Are you efficient, child-oriented or what? A totally objective assessment can't be made." Sicilio said modifications are in order for the career ladder. Sicilio said that when teachers first qualified for the career ladder in 1984, she was told she had made it, and then that she didn't make it. Sicilio was dropped from the career ladder because a three-hour graduate course she took at Texas A&M University was not accepted for her counseling and guidance requirement. "I use counseling every day," Sicilio said. "I don't care about the money. This is just an example of what the career ladder system is like and why I don't think it's good." However, after 25 years of teaching in College Station, Sicilio decided, "It was time to hang up the cleats." "My experience has been wonderful," Sicilio said. "College Hills is outstanding. It's going to be one doesn't leave 34 of teaching and not have very strong feeling. I'm really going to miss this." Sicilio intended to retire at the end of the school year, but decided instead to retire Friday – just after the end of the first semester. "I began

to feel that I wasn't doing the best I could," she said. "My drive had slowed down." Sicilio, who has been training her replacement (Patty Brevard) for the past week, said it was coincidental that Brevard would be the wife of a former student. "I taught her husband in 1970," she said. Sicilio has had an interesting teaching career. When she taught at Robertson Academy in Nashville, Tenn., she taught the son of former Tennessee governor Frank Clemons and the son of Hank William Sr. She has also taught in Shreveport, La., El Paso and Galveston.

Pat Huebner, a sixth-grade math teacher at Oakwood Elementary School, also retired Friday, after 21 years in the College Station school district. Huebner believes there is no such thing as a poor teacher. "You have to be very dedicated to be a teacher," Huebner said. "It's like being in the clergy. You have to love it." "I was dedicated," she said. "I would have done it without a salary." But there was a time when Huebner, a graduate of Texas Woman's University in Denton, wouldn't have taught school "for all the cows in Texas." Huebner became interested in teaching when she became a substitute teacher because of Hurricane Carla. "Teachers weren't able to get back (here) and they were desperate for teachers," she said. Huebner got her emergency teaching certificate and went on from there. Huebner, who also had intended to retire at the end of the school year, said she retired now because she was needed elsewhere. "My daughter was expecting a baby and it was necessary with her," she said. Huebner became the grandmother of an 8-pound, 2-ounce boy New Year's Eve. Huebner said she has enjoyed everything in her teaching career. "The children at all grade levels were wonderful," she said, and she sees the results of her labor everywhere. "There is never a place I go out where I don't see a youngster or a family. That will always be a joy." Huebner said she will now have the time to do things while she can still enjoy them. "I'll have more time to read without having a guilty conscience" and not worry about preparing lessons, Huebner said. "I can relax while I read." "The children in this district are very lucky to have the teachers they do," Huebner said. And maybe they are. Innovator and Farmer Top Huebner Dies

Marion Tolliver (Top) Huebner, 68, died at his home Sunday noon, August 1. He had earlier in the morning worked in his field and when he came in the house he told his wife Jean, to wake him at noon as he was going to take a nap. Presumably death came as he slept. Top Huebner was born in Bay City, March 3, 1908 to Mr. and Mrs. Taylor Huebner. He was third generation in the Huebner family whose farming and ranching operations in Matagorda County began in the 1880's. Top Huebner followed in that tradition and soon after his graduation from Bay City High School in 1926 his responsibilities assumed adult proportions as his father died when Top was in his teens. During World War II, Top served four years with the Sixth Seabees where he saw much action in the Pacific theatre, especially in Guadalcanal. His four years in the Seabees gave him a great opportunity to use his unusual talent and knowledge of machinery and shop work and to improvise when necessary. An innovator, a dreamer, a perfectionist, he turned his knowledge of machinery to practical use when he returned to farming. He was among the first to invent, improve and use portable jack-knife rigs. He devised many labor saving devices and was ever experimenting to produce more and more yield from his acres. In 1956 he was named the outstanding rice farmer of Matagorda County. Six years ago he began to see the possibilities of using the Laser in contour work in the rice fields. He perfected that usage and initiated its many benefits in Texas, Arkansas and Mississippi. Besides his widow, Jean, he is survived by two sons, W. A. (Bill) and D. T. (Doug), and two grandchildren. Also surviving are two brothers, Robert of Buffalo and Raleigh of Bay City and one sister, Lucille, Mrs. Robert Wilkinson. Funeral services were conducted by Rev. W. D. BAY CITY -- Robert Jay ``Bob" Wilkinson, 84, of Bay City, died September 22, 2000 at the Gulf Coast Medical Center in Wharton, Texas. Mr. Wilkinson was born Sept. 9, 1916 in Collegeport, TX to the late Walter William and Helen Lenora Gossett Wilkinson. He graduated from Bay City High School, where he delivered the salutatory address for the class of 1934. In 1938, he graduated from the University of Texas at Austin with a degree in journalism. Mr. Wilkinson was elected to SIGMA DELTA CHI, a national honorary & professional journalism fraternity. He worked on The Daily Texan, the university newspaper, writing the first story about the UT tower illuminated in orange following football victories.
